For the past several years, the CA Club competition has been a run away with the Mother Lode DX & Contest Club putting out major efforts that resulted in wins for several years. However, the Redwood Empire club putting up some serious keeps competition. This year, Redwood Empire came within a hair of winning. This was very close indeed.

It's a little sad to notice that many, many logs show only the wide area clubs that are specifically not allowed to compete in the CQP club competition: NCCC, SCCC, NCDXC, and SCDXC. If you gave one of the above clubs your points, please consider giving your points to your LOCAL club next year.

I thought I'd start out this month by quoting a section of Alan's (AD6E) excellent review of the 2011 California QSO Party. All I can say is, whew! This one was a nail-biter. We earned this win and this is just the way I like to see a competition. I love a good horse race, but I love winning even more!

REDXA has truly become a force to be reckoned with, as a serious competitor in the CQP Club Competition. Just take a look at this chart, from the CQP website:

We all really need to think before we light up the airwaves with our kilowatts, but is it possible that some of these cops have never made a mistake? Are they really that perfect?

So, the Yemen DXpedition may get me in the log if things quiet down a bit. I'd like to work them on 20. Perhaps this weekend I'll give it a try. I'm a contester first, and a DX'er second so, for me, it is not a do or die DXpedition.

600CW, on the other hand, is one that I am going to try real hard to work this coming weekend. If I work them, Somalia will be an all-time new one for me, making them number 320 in my log.

I'm still deep into the final stretch of a repeater re-build project for the El Dorado County club and that has eaten up some of what would normally be quality DX'ing and contesting time. Hopefully, we will wrap up this project in June, allowing me to focus on towers, antennas, and working 'em.

The Joint Meeting is going to be one heck of a good time. We have settled on July 28th as the date and this will truly be a premier meeting between the Mother Lode DX/Contest Club, the Redwood Empire DX Association, and the Northern California Contest Club. 
Tube Of The Month

212D

When I was a kid about 60 years ago, I was messing around a shed in my back yard. We were always afraid of going inside as it looked like a hotel for black widow spiders. The walls were falling in and there was a deep pile of trash all over the floor. Through a crack in the wall I saw something interesting and had to have After I braved the spiders and it. hauled it off, it turned out to be a Western Electric 212D tube. My father told me that it came from radio KMJ in He had acquired it before Fresno. WWII and has considering making an amplifier with it. The tube was over a foot in length and had 4 pins arranged in an odd pattern. About ten years later when I became a ham the tube has always been displayed in my shack.

I eventually learned more about these tubes and the history of this one. The McClatchy Company, who owned the Sacramento and Fresno Bee newspapers, also owned the AM radio stations KFBK and KMJ. In 1928 they upgraded their transmitters to larger units made by Western Electric. equipment Previous mostly was "homebrew". A Sacramento ham was in charge of installing the new rigs that used the 212D tubes as amplifiers. The 212D was an excellent audio amplifier and could be used in the RF section, but only to 1.5 MHz. Each tube had a number on the glass that indicated the range of impedance.

Tubes could be matched to evenly share the load. By 1936 they were considered obsolete although the 212E was used through the 1940s.



Like the old 211 tubes, the audio capabilities and the 250 watts of power made them highly desirable to

audio amplifier builders. They quickly went from junk to gold. Recent prices for a good working 212D or E have risen to over \$1000. I'm glad I was able to find all my 212s when they were still considered junk. My 212D now has many friends, but it was the first.



1A, S.M.O.M. (Press Release #1)

"Thirty years have passed since 1A made its way onto the DXCC list. And an activation by an International team looks to celebrate the uniqueness of this event. So, from the 1st to the 4th July, we will listen them on the air as 1AOC from Santa Maria del Priorato, home of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta. The callsign that will be used belongs to the 'The Order of Malta's Italian Relief Corps (CISOM)", an organization specialized in bringing assistance and relief during emergencies. This underscores the dual value of this activation. On the one hand, there's the fun side ham radio, giving a not so easy 'new one' to as many stations as possible (especially from the U.S. and Japan). On the other hand, however, there's the noble goal, as often seen in ham radio, where a spirit of cooperation and mutual aid are shared by operators all over the world. The team's aim, in fact, is to raise funds thanks to donations and contributions from QSL requests in order to buy radio equipment which The Order of Malta's Italian Relief Corps volunteers will be able to use in case of emergencies.

The operators list includes: 1A0X, 1A0Z, EA2RY, EA5RM, EA7AJR, EA7KW, F5CWU, IN3ZNR, IT9YVO, IZ8IYX, PB2T, SP3DOI and KH6CG as a pilot for North America and Pacific. They will be active on HF+6m and the QSLs for contacts with 1A0C can be requested via Francesco Cozzi, 1A0Z. A website will be online soon, stay tuned! 73 de 1A0C"

"I wasn't charged with espionage. As a reason of my arrest it was stated that: 1. I performed radio traffic without the approval of the Greek authorities; 2. I owned transmitting equipment which enabled the reception of other frequencies;

To the accusation was later added an

other point: I hindered the visualization of the content of my notebook." Kostas, SV1DPI, also reported an update on June 9th, stating [edited]: "According to the RAAG's site, the Court decided yesterday (June 8th) that Baldur is innocent for the first accuse (operating his rig). According to the Court for the 2nd accuse (destroy of his computer and possible evidence of his activity), he was guilty. This second case will be examined again in the future, and I hope they get the right decision in the future. Baldur was, of course, in Germany (he left after the first judge) and only his lawyer was at the Court. My opinion is that what happened was by mistake in an island (Kos) very close to Turkey (the 2 coasts are only some meters far) where the Authorities were too suspicious... When Greek or foreign hams ask for special calls from the Islands which are too close to our borders, the Navy has been asked for approval. If Greece would like to have this policy for some of the islands, it should have signed the CEPT with the exception of these islands but we didn't. So everyone should have better knowledge of the laws and stop asking these papers in general because it has no sense. But unfortunately it seems that we have more important things to do during this time frame... All SV hams, we ask from Baldur to forgive our country for the bad behavior ... "



<u>SOLAR UPDATE</u>



The Sun, as seen on Thursday, June 7, 2012 from <u>NASA's</u> <u>SOHO Extreme Ultraviolet</u> <u>Imaging Telescope</u>. This <u>MDI</u> (Michelson Doppler Imager) image was taken in the continuum near the Ni I 6768 Angstrom line. The most prominent features are the sunspots. This is very much how the Sun looks in the visible range of the spectrum.

Tad "There's a fire starting in my heart" Cook, K7RA, reports: The average daily sunspot numbers increased about 60 percent during the past week (May 31-June 6), when compared to previous the seven days (May 24-30). The increase was 48.5 from points. 81.9 to 130.4. The average daily solar flux was also up --

18.6 points from 111.6 to 130.2. This increase in solar activity began June 1. On May 29, the daily sunspot number was 73, with four sunspot

groups visible: 1486, 1488, 1490 and 1492. On May 30, the size of groups 1486, 1488 and 1492 diminished, but 1490 grew, and the sunspot number was 78. On May 31, sunspot groups 1486 and 1488 disappeared, and new groups 1493, 1494 and 1495 appeared, but the daily sunspot number was still about the same, 76. On June 1, three new groups appeared -- 1496, 1497 and 1498 -- and the daily sunspot number jumped to 151. The next day the sunspot number was 113. On June 3, sunspot group 1499 appeared and the sunspot number was 133. On June 4, three more sunspot groups arose: 1500, 1501 and 1502. Groups 1490 and 1492disappeared, and the sunspot number jumped again, this time to 155, the high for the week and the highest since May 14 when it was 156. Geomagnetic activity peaked on June 3, when the planetary A index was 19, and the high-latitude college A index was 33. The activity continues, with the planetary A index on June 4-6 at 16, 17 and 17, and the predicted planetary A index for June 7-8 at 12 and 8, followed by 5 on June 9-17. Geomagnetic activity is expected to increase again, with a predicted planetary A index on June 18-20 at 15, 12 and 8. For June 21-25 a planetary A index of 5 is expected, followed by another peak at 15 on July 1 and again on July 15. The predicted solar flux is 140 on June 7-9, 135 on June 10-11, 130 and 125 on June 12-13, 120 on June 14-15, 115 on June 16-18, and 110 on June 19-26. The recent geomagnetic activity was caused by a coronal hole, an opening in our Sun's magnetic field, allowing solar wind to spew forth. Look for more on the ARRL website on Friday, June 8.
