Hi Mother Lode'ers!

I had a terrific time in Visalia. I worked the registration desk for the second time and, frankly, this is one of my favorite things to do there. I got to see a lot of my East Coast friends, as well as the West Coast guys. The contest dinner was also a lot of fun.

I think most of us in the club are now using ClubLog. How many of you have dug down deep into the rankings of those in our club?

At the last meeting, Dave, W6DE, with a big grin on his face, told me he had passed me up in the Club Log ranking. I congratulated Dave, while saying to myself...."not for long, Dave!". More on that thought in a bit.

Here's the current top ten clubs:

And, are we?

Out of 85 clubs, we rank #24, with 37 members. We average 254 DXCC's.

Back to Dave's big grin.

ClubLog allows you to really dig down into individual DXCC numbers. If you look at all bands, current entities, ranking by DXCC's, worked, and with

no date filter, Dave does beat me, with 324 DXCC's (1244 slots), to my 321 (1184). Dave ranks #11 in MLDXCC. I rank #12.

So, I went to 6 meters, confirmed. Now, we have a very different list of leaders:

After that, a number of our club members have 5 or fewer confirmed. K6TA has 3 confirmed. Time for Ken to invest in some serious power and aluminum for 6?

I do have Dave beat on 6 by my 4 to his 2. Take that, Dave!

It is really interesting to look at 2 meters and 70 cm. It's all K6YK, with 22 confirmed on 2 meters and 33 confirmed on 70 cm. Say what? 33 countries confirmed on 432? What mode, John? Moon bounce? Scatter? Now there's some numbers for club members to challenge!

OK, back to HF. How about the WARC bands? Here's the list:



Tube of the Month de Norm, N6JV

Tube of the Month The 750T



As a young man when I was just getting serious about chasing DX, I

was lucky to be around hams that became famous for their pioneering work. I once met an older ham who heard of my interest in old tubes. He said that if I came over to Moraga he would give me an old 750T for my He was Reg Tibbetts, collection. W6ITH, and he told me some tales of ham radio and tubes. Eimac has began business in 1934, the year he graduated from UC Berkley. He was a great builder of equipment and by 1936 had six separate transmitters build into nine six-foot racks. Reg was a "phone" man and wanted to run the legal limit on AM Phone, class A. Tubes that would take that power and frequency were not available. friends at Eimac had been making a very nice tube, the 300T, but it was just too small. Reg convinced them to make an upsized tube that they called the 500T. Reg was in business and a monster amp with a pair of 500Ts was on the air. Eimac added the 500T to their tube line and before WWII, changed its name to the 750T and later to the 750TL. It was 17 inches tall and was the first of the big glass tubes produced at Eimac. By WWII having a big rig had its downside. The Navy came to his shack and hauled away the racks. It seems they were short on panel meters.

Reg's first big project was to build and sell the 5-meter portable transceivers that were used during the building of the Oakland-Bay Bridge. After the War, he worked for UPI and installed shortwave stations all over the world. He had an interest in a plantation on the French side of Saint Martin and wanted to run his ham gear from

there, but there had never been ham radio on the island and there was no prefix allocation. On the plane to Saint Martin, Reg composed a letter authorizing him to operate under the call FS7RT. He somehow convinced the Governor to sign the letter and he began operating. The French telecom people didn't know what to do, but eventually the FS prefix became official.

I have been mostly off the air for most of this year due to continuing problems with the tilt over winch for the 106 foot tower. A coax connection loosened up at the top of the tower which disabled the MonstIR, and I was unable to access it to fix it.

Yesterday, I finally completed the installation of a new motorized tilt over winch, which worked flawlessly, unlike the two previous hand winches. I was able to

fix the bad coax connector, and uninstall a birds nest from the tilt plate, and then reerect the tower. The MonstIR sure sounded great last night.

The winch is NOT from US Tower, but rather is a boat lift winch I adapted.

While off the air, I used the time to catch up on QSL'ing and now have 306 mixed DXCC confirmed (not counting deleted) and have completed 6BWAS mixed and CW. Only 3 to go for phone.

My research into receiving antennas continued while the winch project was in progress. I picked up a Pixel loop at Visalia to evaluate and compare to the loop in my NCJ article. I may make some improvements to that desian. am also planning to sell some assembled versions of the NCJ loop that some people have requested.

I am now semi-retired, working 3 days a week at Agilent in the bay area. I have a place in Santa Clara to stay on Tuesday and Wednesday nights, so I only do the 100 mile commute once a week.

I recently bought an Econoline van which I am planning to use to reactivate my Hi-Q screwdriver. It has a large roof rack for hauling antennas am I am thinking about some sort of field day operation from it.

I ordered a couple of the 5B4AGN band pass filter kits which will be used to operate SO2R in upcoming contests. I am also planning to set up a second operating position for multi-2 contests, which will also involve the filters.

Introductions. Round-the-room introductions were made, including guest K6SCA, Steve.

Officers' Roll Call. Present were Bob, President; Kay, K6KO, Secretary; Norm, N6JV, website administrator; Shirl, AA6K, Director; and Ray, ND6S, Director.

Secretary's Minutes and Treasurer's Report. The 9 February 2013 Secretary's minutes and Treasurer's report were approved as published in the March *Nugget* newsletter.

Upcoming DXpeditions/DX News. Upcoming DXpeditions and current DX news are detailed in the February 2013 *Nugget* newsletter, available on the Club's websiste, www.mldx-cc.org.

Recognition of Achievements. Bob, W1RH, reported on the NCCC Awards Dinner held in Mountain View on 11 March. Among those honored were contest station K6C, operated by W1RH and AA1ON, for their 1st Place, M/S, El Dorado county in the 2012 CQP, and W6RFF for his 1st Place Sacramento Valley in the 2012 ARRL DX contest.

Station News. Shirl, AA6K, needs a "new" used tower. The base plate on his current tower was damaged in recent high winds.

Awards Committee. It was moved and seconded that the Club sponsor the First Place, Single Op, Low Power Non-California Plaque in the California QSO Party.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Meeting Dates, Venues and **Presentations.** As in previous years, no April meeting will be held as so many members will be in attendance at the Visalia IDXC. Tentatively, the May meeting will be held on the 18th at a location to be announced later. Possible June dates that wouldn't interfere with other activities are the 1st and the 15th. Suggestions for a raffle to be held at the Visalia Contest Dinner were discussed, posed as a motion and passed. Bob, W1RH, agreed to coordinate the effort. Dave, W6DE, advised Club members using ClubLog that their accounts need to be updated annually or they would lose their log standing. An announcement from Visalia cochairman John, K6MM, detailed the schedule of events at the 2013 IDXC and offered the option of an MLDXCC Club table in the main hall; participation by the Club was deferred until the 2014 convention. Log Flogger Shirl, AA6K, needs a list of club calls for future log submissions. Discussion of the CQWW Activity Map was deferred until Dick, K6LRN and Carolyn, K6TKD, are present. Norm, N6JV, brought the tube detailed in the current newsletter.





The Sun, as seen on Thursday, May 9, 2013 from NASA's SOHO Extreme Ultraviolet Imaging Telescope. This MDI (Michelson Doppler Imager) image was taken in the continuum near the Ni I 6768 Angstrom line. The most prominent features are the sunspots. This is very much how the Sun looks in the visible range of the spectrum.

Tad Cook, K7RA, reports: This week, the average daily sunspot numbers remained about the same, with the number nudging up from 120.9 to 121.7, while the average daily solar flux numbers went from 136.5 to 137.5. For the past two weeks, the average planetary A index has been the same as the

mid-latitude A index. Last week they were both 9.9; this week, both values were 8. The predicted solar flux for the near future is 125 on May 9-10, 120 on May 11-13, 115 on May 14-15, 120 on May 16-17, 125 on May 18, and rising to 130 on May 19-20. The predicted planetary A index is 5 on May 9-20, then 15, 10 and 15 on May 21-23, 5 on May 24-27, and rising to 15 and 10 for May 28-29.
