What: This month our meeting will feature a video travelogue of recent DXPeditions.



<u>Tube of the Month de Norm, N6JV</u>

TYPE "U" Pliotron

Early vacuum tubes were often given names and In 1913 the General Electric not numbers. Company decided to give names to reflect the characteristics of the different types of tubes they were experimenting with. I guess it was fashionable to use Greek or Latin names, as was the practice when naming new species. Pliotron was chosen for the triode tubes. Pleion in Greek is "more" and tron is an instrument. A pliotron gives you more or it amplifies. GE produced many tubes during World War I for the military. Commercial use of transmitting tubes essentially didn't exist. Near the end of the war, more powerful tubes were being made. A 50-watt version was especially useful and designated the "U" Pliotron. It used a special bayonet socket. Today this size and shape of tube and the socket are still called "50 Watter". Insulation between the four pins was made of mica and very weak. About 1200 of these tubes was made for the Navy who gave it the designation CG-1144 and 200 for the Army who called it a VT-18. The Navy used these tubes in their seaplane This tube was a natural for transmitters. commercial and amateur radio equipment, so after the war ended, GE came out with an improved tube designated the UV203 and was a big hit with hams who could afford it. For the next 30 years the 50 watter was modified and improved. The construction of the 203 limited its upper frequency, but this shape of tube is still very popular in audio as in the 211 and 845 types.

P.S. Business not covered that, IMO, should have been...clarification of dues structure & budget.





The Sun, as seen on Thursday, September 1, 2011 from <u>NASA's SOHO Extreme</u> <u>Ultraviolet Imaging Telescope</u>. This <u>MDI</u> (Michelson Doppler Imager) image was taken in the continuum near the Ni I 6768 Angstrom line. The most prominent features are the sunspots. This is very much how the Sun looks in the visible range of the spectrum.

Tad "September Sun, blowing golden hair" Cook. K7RA. reports:Sunspo t activity rose again this week, with the average daily sunspot number up nearly 18 points to 83.6, but the geomagnetic indices were down slightly. The high sunspot number for the week -- 121 -was recorded

on Wednesday,

August 31. The last time the sunspot number was higher was on July 31 at 128 and August 1 at 130. The predicted solar flux is 110 on September 1-2, 105 on September 3, 100 on September 4-5, 95, 90, 90, 85, 90, 92 and 95 on September 6-12, 100 on September 13-15, and finally peaking at 105 on September 18-22. The predicted planetary A index is 5 on September 12, 8 on September 3-4, 5 on September 5-10, and then 8, 12, 8 and 5 on September 11-14.
